HEALTH AND SAFETY CODE TITLE 9. SAFETY SUBTITLE B. EMERGENCIES CHAPTER 772. LOCAL ADMINISTRATION OF EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS

SUBCHAPTER G. REGIONAL EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS DISTRICTS: STATE PLANNING REGION WITH POPULATION OVER 1.5 MILLION

Sec. 772.521. PUBLIC REVIEW. (a) Periodically, the board shall solicit public comments and hold a public review hearing on 67 the continuation of the district and the 9-1-1 emergency service fee. The first hearing shall be held on or before the third anniversary of the date of the district 's creation. Subsequent hearings shall be held on or before the third anniversary of the date each resolution required by Subsection (c) is adopted.

(b) The board shall publish notice of the time and place of a hearing once a week for two consecutive weeks in a daily newspaper of general circulation published in the district. The first notice must be published not later than the 16th day before the date set for the hearing.

(c) After the hearing, the board shall adopt a resolution on the continuation or dissolution of the district and the 9-1-1 emergency service fee.

A RESOLUTION REGARDING CONTINUATION OF THE DISTRICT AND THE 9-1-1 SERVICE FEE

WHEREAS, the Capital Area Emergency Communications District Board of Managers convened in regular session on the 14th day of May, 2025 at the Capital Area Council of Governments Office, 6800 Burleson Road, Build-ing 310, Suite 165, Austin, Texas; and

WHEREAS, the meeting was called to order by the Chairman, having a quorum present; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held after it had been established that notice of the time and place of the public hearing was published once a week for two consecutive weeks in a daily newspaper of general circulation in the district with the first publication of notice being not less than sixteen days before the date of the hearing; and

WHEREAS, the public hearing was opened at ______a.m. and thereafter public comment was received regarding the desirability of continuing the District and the 9-1-1 service fee in Bastrop, Blanco, Burnet, Caldwell, Fayette, Hays, Lee, Llano, Travis and Williamson Counties, Texas; and

WHEREAS, _____, comments were made from interested citizens in the public hearing in favor of the 9-1-1 district and service fee and in support of continuing the district and the fee; and

WHEREAS, _____, comments were made in favor of discontinuing the 9-1-1 district and service fee; and

WHEREAS, after a proper motion was made and was seconded, the public hearing was closed at ____a.m; and

WHEREAS, Section 772, Texas Health and Safety Code, requires the Board of Managers to adopt an order for the continuation or dissolution of the district and the 9-1-1 emergency fee;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF MANAGERS OF THE CAPITAL AREA EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS DISTRICT THAT: The Capital Area Emergency Communications District and the emergency service fee imposed shall be continued as provided by Chapter 772 of the Texas Health and Safety Code and in compliance with provisions of such statute.

AGENDA ITEM: 5. Consider Adoption of Resolution Setting the 9-1-1 Service Fee for FY2026

GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF ITEM:

In Texas, there are three components to the overall 9-1-1 fee:

- 9-1-1 Service Fee; charged to each local access line or equivalent and known as traditional landline service, currently \$.50 per month.
- 9-1-1 Wireless Fee; charged to each activated cell phone, currently \$.50 per month.
- 9-1-1 Prepaid Wireless Fee, currently two percent (2%) of the purchase price.

The 9-1-1 wireless fee and the 9-1-1 prepaid wireless fee are set at the state level. The 9-1-1 service fee is set by the state for the Councils of Government and by the boards of each Emergency Communications District or Municipal Emergency Communications District.

Texas Health and Safety Code Section 772.516 (e) requires the district board to set the 9-1-1 service fee each year as part of the annual budget. The 9-1-1 service fee pertains to the traditional landline and Voice over Internet Provider (VoIP) telephone services within the district and is charged to each residential line, business line and business trunk. The FY 2026 budget to be reviewed by the Board of Managers in July 2025 will retain the \$.50 rate for the year.

A RESOLUTION CLASSIFYING RATES FOR THE 9-1-1 EMERGENCY SERVICE FEE ON SERVICE USERS FOR LOCAL EXCHANGE ACCESS LINES AND EQUIVALENT LOCAL EXCHANGE ACCESS LINES

WHEREAS, the Capital Area Emergency Communications District Board of Managers is authorized by Texas Health and Safety Code, Chapter 772 to impose a 9-1-1 emergency service fee on service users for local exchange access lines and equivalent local exchange access lines;

WHEREAS, in accordance with Texas Health and Safety Code, Section 771.063, the Capital Area Emergency Communications District is required to follow the definition of a local exchange access line and an equivalent local exchange access line as adopted by rule by the Commission on State Emergency Communications;

WHEREAS, in accordance with Texas Health and Safety Code Chapter 772.516(d), the rate of the fee may not exceed six percent of the monthly base rate charged a service user by the principal service supplier in the participating jurisdiction;

WHEREAS, in accordance with Texas Health and Safety Code Chapter 772.516(e), the board shall set the amount of the fee each year as part of the annual budget; and

WHEREAS, the schedule of fee rates and classifications recommended by District management for Fiscal Year 2024 complies with the six percent cap in Texas Health and Safety Code, Chapter 772.516(d).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF MANAGERS OF THE CAPITAL AREA EMER-GENCY COMMUNICATIONS DISTRICT THAT: The 9-1-1 emergency service fee rates and classifications for Fiscal Year 2026 are hereby levied at the monthly rate of \$.50 per line for residential lines, business lines and business trunks. The fees are applied to a maximum of 100 lines per customer bill, per location.
