1. Call to Order

Commissioner Terry Cook called the meeting to order at 9:30 a.m.

2. Welcome and Introductions

Commissioner Cook initiated the member welcomes and introductions.

3. Public Comment (3 Minutes per Speaker)

Commissioner Cook asked for public comments from guests. No comments were presented.

4. ACTION ITEM: Approval of May 2, 2025, Meeting Minutes

Commissioner Cook requested a motion to approve May 02, 2025, meeting minutes. Commissioner Linda Raschke moved to approve. Commissioner Michelle Cohen, PhD, seconded the motion. The motion to approve May 02, 2025, meeting minutes passed unanimously.

5. Presentation: Evolving Freight Rail Policy and Long-Term Infrastructure Trends

Brett Sebastian, State Director, GoRail presented on Evolving Freight Rail Policy and Long-Term Infrastructure Trends. Commissioner Cook asked if there are ways the freight rails can act as a dry land ferry. Mr. Sebastian explained this concept exists in the United States but is most common in the East Coast/New England regions as well as Europe. Commissioner Cook asked in relation to the rise in railroad related crimes if there are any cyber security issues that may reveal the exact locations of

valuables within the railcars. Mr. Sebastian explained this is certainly being recognized as cybersecurity risks and legislation is being considered to address these cyber risks. Commissioner Cook asked if the use of drone surveillance can be used to assist in railcar thefts. Mr. Sebastian explained that even though drone surveillance is in current use, the highly organized theft rings are quick and efficient in their methods and drone response times can be delayed.

6. Presentation: Advancing Safety on Rural Roadways — Current Initiatives and Strategic Outlook Kevin Elliott, Senior Marketing & Communication Strategist, National Center for Rural Road Safety presented via Microsoft Teams on Advancing Safety on Rural Roadways — Current Initiatives and Strategic Outlook.

Commissioner Raschke left the meeting at 10:11 a.m.

Mr. Ricardo E Rendon left the meeting at 10:12 a.m.

Mr. Rendon returned to the meeting at 10:15 a.m.

Commissioner Raschke returned to the meeting at 10:17 a.m.

Commissioner Cook asked if the closing of rural emergency medical facilities affects EMS response times to traffic accidents. Mr. Elliot explained the closing of rural emergency medical facilities does impact the response times and the National Center for Rural Road Safety has begun trainings for these impacted areas focusing on teaching communities to stop and assist when encountering traffic accidents, training more people in first responder skill such as stop the bleed, CPR and first aid, as well as, helping rural emergency response services being equipped with whole blood.

7. Presentation: Rail Quiet Zones and the Role of MovingCentralTexas.org in Regional Planning Simon Fichter, Transportation Planner, CAPCOG, presented information on Rail Quiet Zones and the Role of MovingCentralTexas.org in Regional Planning.

Commissioner Michelle Cohen, PhD., left the meeting at 10:27 am.

Mayor Lew White asked if there is data available showing the percentage of quiet zone applications that railroad companies reject. Mr. Fichter explained that to his knowledge there was not, but that railroad companies rarely reject completed quiet zone applications. Commissioner Cook wanted clarification on the Round Rock quiet zones that were established and then removed. Mr. Fichter explained he was made aware of this unique change with quiet zones in Round Rock and has reached out for more information and has not received anything new.

Michelle Conkle asked if Mr. Fichter reported incorrect data when discovered from the TxDOT website. Mr. Fichter stated yes, he does provide feedback to the agency when information needs updating. Commissioner Alan Turner asked if the crash analysis tools track the causes of crashes. Mr. Fichter stated that currently it did not but explained that this feature would be added in the future.

8. Roundtable Discussion

Commissioner Cook opened the meeting to roundtable discussion. Members discussed emergency medical services on rural areas and gaps in critical medical care services which are deeply impacting by recent rural facilities closing due to federal health care budget cuts.

Michael Shear, CEO of Strategic Office Networks and Advisor to the Autonomy Institute, will present on Distributed Work Centers. These centers house multiple employers in dedicated office suites, tailored to local hiring needs, and are securely connected via private broadband, ensuring high-capacity, low-latency communication. This distributed model not only alleviates traffic congestion and creates local job opportunities but also supports advanced technologies such as virtual presence, holographic telepresence, and augmented reality. Additionally, centers have the potential to offer remote education, healthcare services, community events, and emergency response capabilities. Operating through a public-private partnership, the model integrates real estate and ICT infrastructure to meet the needs of a knowledge-based workforce, boosting productivity, quality of life, and sustainable economic growth.

At the August CARTPO meeting, staff provided an update on the Capital Area Regional Safety Action Plan (CARSAP), which focuses on identifying the most hazardous intersections in Blanco, Llano, and Lee counties and developing preliminary designs to advance those projects toward construction readiness.

Since that meeting, the U.S. Department of Transportation announced a funding opportunity through its Rural and Tribal Assistance Pilot Program, for which the CARSAP qualifies. CAPCOG has submitted an application and is awaiting a response from USDOT. If the grant is awarded, the project scope will expand to include full engineering designs for the proposed improvements.
